Dear Parents and Caregivers,

With National Literacy and Numeracy Week less than a week away, I wonder what you are reading at the moment?

The skills of reading are so important in most aspects of our society, for work as well as enjoyment. At Trinity we value literature and empowering children to be able to read anything and everything.

This week, as I think about it, I am readinga graphic novel of 'Spiderman' (with my son), the latest edition of Big League magazine, a text on educational leadership, a chapter of a formation book called' "Forming Intentional Disciples', Acts of the Apostles from the bible with an accompanying commentary. That's a lot of reading as I think about it.

I wonder what your child is reading at the moment? Over the next week why not take some time and sit and read with them. Arrays

Arrays are an arrangement of counters (or collection of small objects) into a rectangular shape of rows and columns. They assist students to visualise multiplication facts.



An activity that is often used at school is **Array Busting.**Make an array with 6 rows of 5 counters (any numbers can be used).
Children have 2 minutes to find as many smaller arrays as possible.
Children record new arrays. Share with a partner and write number sentences for their array. Some questions that are discussed include: Who found the most? What are some interesting arrays? What do you notice about arrays.


Literacy Hint

Read aloud with drama and excitement! Use different voices for different characters in the story. Use your child's name instead of a character's name. Make puppets and use them to act out a story.



Numeracy Hint

Have your children make or draw arrays to help them learn multiplication facts. (Times Tables).



SACRED SPACE

Did you know that the Feast of the Assumption, last Friday, 15th August, was a holy day of obligation.? The Australian Catholic Bishops' Conference determined that, in addition to all the Sundays in the year, the only feast days to be observed in Australia as holy days of obligation are the solemnities of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Chris (Christmas) t and the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The Decree of Promulgation became effective on 16 September, 2001.

DECREE OF PROMULGATION

On 28 November 1996, the Australian Catholic Bishops' Conference made the following decree: That 15 August (the solemnity of the Assumption) be a holy day of obligation in Australia, even when it falls on a Saturday or a Monday.

That decree was reviewed and confirmed by the Congregation for Divine Worship & Discipline of the Sacraments, by virtue of faculties granted it by Pope John Paul II, and by means of a recognitio (Prot. N: 366/97/L) signed on 23 January 2001 by the Prefect, Cardinal Jorge Medina Estevez, and the Secretary, Archbishop Francesco Pio Tamburrino.

The decree effectively modifies the decrees of the Australian Catholic Bishops' Conference concerning holy days of obligation effective from 1985 and 1991 so that, in addition to all the Sundays of the year, the only feast days henceforth to be observed in Australia as holydays of obligation are the solemnities of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ and the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Moreover, these two holy days of obligation are to be observed annually, regardless of the day of the week on which they fall.

Parents, grandparents, preschoolers and friends are welcome!

- ~ All children dress as any book character (may also be a movie character).
- ~ Children may wear their costume to school if they are comfortable in these clothes in their learning group and on the playground. Otherwise, they will need to be able to change at Recess themselves or with your help. Children may need to bring additional warm clothing (not uniform) to wear while they are waiting for their turn to parade. Swords, guns and boots with studs are not suitable for the parade.
- ~ Pre schoolers may also dress up and parade with their big sister/brother/cousin.

It would be helpful if children hold the book or carry a sign or wear a label with their character's or book's name.
