Sacred Space

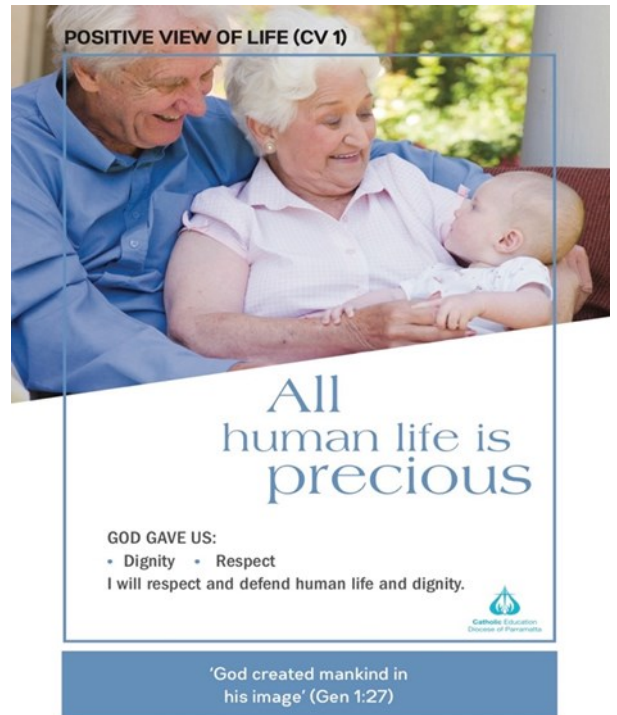
Catholic Value

The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. Human life should be protected

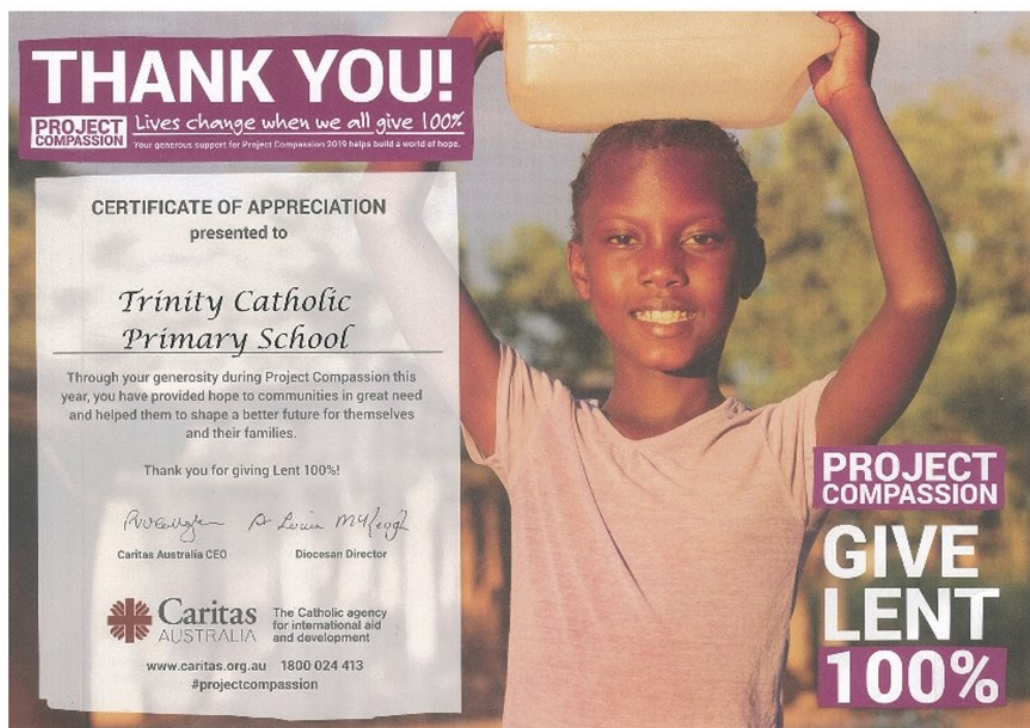
All human life is precious.

PBS4L



PBS4L stands for Positive Behaviour 4 Learning.
At Trinity we agree to 3 PBS4L expectations:

We are SAFE
We are RESPECTFUL
We are LEARNERS

Positive Behaviour Support for Learning (PBS4L) is a whole school framework that helps create positive learning environments to maximise students learning and enhance student and staff wellbeing. The philosophy of PBS4L is to teach behaviour in the same way we teach educational content.

The PBS4L framework is a research based and proactive school wide system that establishes clear behaviour expectations. PBS4L encourages consistency amongst teachers in our approach to behaviour management both in acknowledging and reinforcing positive behaviours. The process involves explicitly teaching and re-teaching students how to enact positive behaviours.

We have adopted the whole school approach of PBS4L to bring about positive behaviour and improve student learning. We have a strong emphasis on teaching appropriate behaviours and providing systems that support but also encourage positive behaviour.

Current Goanna Goal: We can show respect at school.

It has been wonderful to see so many students receiving Mamre awards at assembly. We know that they are hard to earn and it has been excellent to see more gold awards being handed out to the older students! Mrs Hey will have a busy gold award morning tea this term.

The PBS4L team have been watching each grade during eating time at recess to see who keeps their area tidy and then transitions safely to the pavers. It has been great to walk out and see a clean playground as a result of the cooperation between each grade and have different grades earning the goanna in the garden each day.

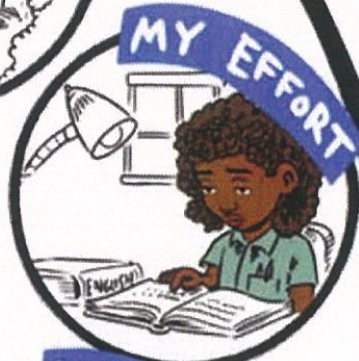
