Please be aware

As the weather gets warmer, the wildlife tends to make more appearances in and around the school grounds. We remind the children not to approach them and report to a staff member if they see one. Please supervise your children in the afternoon when you pick up from school. Occasionally at this time of year, small (and not so small) legless reptiles sun themselves during the day, usually away from the paths and in the grass or near bushes. If you're having a chat on your way to your car, ensure that your children are in a safe area and remind them not to approach any of the wildlife.



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Reports

At this busy time of the year, teachers are making final preparations for the End of Year reports. Each Key Learning Area will continue to provide an overall grade from E-A for Years 1 – 6. The number under each grade indicates how many students received that grade. (This grading system is a government mandated requirement)

Kindergarten achievement will be indicated with the following scale;

Working Towards, Achieved with Support, Achieved, Working Beyond.

Each Key Learning Area will have a table of achievement referring to some more subject specific information.

The teachers will also write a comment for Religious Education, English, Mathematics and a General comment.

Another table will describe personal traits and learning behaviours.

Reports will be sent home on Wednesday 11th December, 2019.
