




## Reading for FUN afternoon



## Do you have the Information you need?

Thank you to the many parents who contact the teachers, the office, Mr Bond or Mrs Hey directly with questions, feedback, issues and more importantly to seek clarification. Society is such that information is often misconstrued or acts like 'chinese whispers'. Today's sensationalistic media does not help with the dissemination of accurate information. It is always paramount that if you are unsure that you speak to the people that know and have the correct information. To that end, please always send any emails to trinity@parra.catholic.edu.au and these will be forwarded to your child's teacher, Mr Bond or Mrs Hey. Please DO NOT send any emails to your child's teacher directly.

#### Why is my child's teacher out of class?

Like professionals in other fields, all teachers are required to keep up to date with current thinking on best practices and new developments in all curriculum areas. From time to time teachers are required to attend professional development opportunities to learn about changes to curriculum, new methods of teaching and learning and other ways of integrating technology. These sessions sometimes occur during the day, after school or in the school holidays. Teachers are also given time at the beginning of the year to conduct assessments to pinpoint your child's learning needs. Some teachers also have additional responsibilities which benefit the whole school. At times, teachers are also required at diocesan events etc. Teachers also have entitlements such as sick leave, long service leave, maternity leave, bereavement leave, jury duty etc. Consequently, there will be times when your child's teacher is absent from the classroom. On these days the teacher's program and day plan is followed. Teachers on a grade work closely together allowing the grade partners to liaise with the casual teacher so that good teaching and learning continues, and routines are kept. We thank you for your support in this area.

#### Parent Helpers?



Have you completed your Child Protection for Volunteers Training? It has been pleasing to see how many of our parents, grandparents, etc, have completed the Child Protection Training in anticipation of helping out at school. PBS4L stands for Positive Behaviour 4 Learning. At Trinity we agree to 3 PBS4L expectations:

We are SAFE
We are RESPECTFUL
We are LEARNERS


The expectations are displayed in all learning spaces, throughout the school and publicised to the wider school community. At Trinity, we proactively teach students the skills needed to be safe, respectful, learners.

As a school we recognise that positive reinforcement is the most powerful behaviour change. By encouraging and reinforcing students for following the expected behaviours we foster a positive school climate as well as reduce the need for engaging in time consuming disciplinary measures.

You might have heard about your child earning a paw-sitive already this year which is fantastic news! Each student has a paw-sitive card and can earn paw-prints for any positive behaviours seen by the teachers.

Paw Print Cards and Goannas in the Garden are used as free and frequent rewards at Trinity meaning students can earn them regularly. Paw Print cards are individual rewards. When students are seen being safe, respectful, learners they are rewarded with a pawprint. When they receive ten paw prints, they are rewarded with a prize.





The Goannas in the Garden are a whole grade reward. When students are seen making a positive choice as a grade, they are rewarded with a goanna. When the grade earns ten, they receive an agreed upon class reward.






