#### COVID-19

COVID 19 Important Self Isolation Information Advice about how to manage self-isolation, particularly with siblings, is available from NSW Health and from the Western Sydney Local Health District Community Resources website. Importantly:

- A student should not come to school if they are unable to isolate from a sibling or family member who is a confirmed close contact of COVID-19.
- Where families find it difficult to isolate siblings from other family members who are a confirmed close contacts of someone with COVID-19, the sibling should not attend school during the period of isolation;
- If a parent/carer is unable to isolate effectively from a child identified as a close contact, they should not attend work during the close contact's isolation period. Family members of close contacts are asked to keep a very close watch for COVID-19 symptoms and follow medical advice.

#### M.A.I Mathematical Assessment Interviews

At the beginning of the 2021 school year the teachers at Trinity will again be administering the Mathematical Assessment Interview (MAI) from Year 1 to Year 6. This is a 1:1 interview with a student and takes approximately 30 minutes. The information gathered from this assessment will assist the teacher's knowledge of where the students are in their understanding of number. Later this term, families will receive a login code to use with the school interview online booking tool to organise an appointment time. The MAI interviews will take place on Wednesday 27th and Thursday 28th January 2021. Please note that all interviews will be held in the 2021 learning spaces. Any child who is not assessed at one of these opportunities will be assessed as soon as possible in the first weeks of school.

### Notification if moving from Trinity

We have healthy enrolments for most classes in 2021 and now have waiting lists for some classes. In fairness to these families we ask you to let us know, in writing, if you are changing schools for 2021. If you know of anyone considering a Catholic school education for their child at Trinity from 2021, in any grade, please encourage them to contact the school as soon as possible to assist us with our planning.



#### Tech tips:



Helping your children stay safe while browsing the internet.

<u>Set Rules</u> - Create a standard for your child to know what kind of content they should be looking at/sharing while they are on the internet. Encourage them to use the same behaviour online that they would use in real life. Encourage your child to browse the web in a shared or visible place at home and explore the internet with them.

<u>Teach</u>- Teach your child how to deal with any inappropriate content or messages they come across using block or mute functions as well as reporting it. If necessary quit the webpage or shut down the device. This also includes teaching your child how to tell a trusted adult.

<u>Remind -</u> Remind your children about the importance of private information staying private online and how private information can be used to identify them.

#### R.E.D Journal Annual Collection



When children stop reading for extended periods they often take a few steps backwards in their reading improvement. For this reason it is important to encourage children to keep reading for enjoyment during the holidays. How can I help my child become a successful reader? and My child doesn't want to read, how can I encourage them to read more?




#### **OUR READING STAR THIS WEEK IS:**
