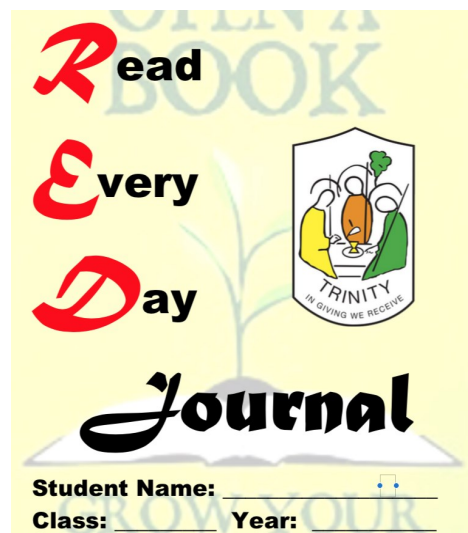
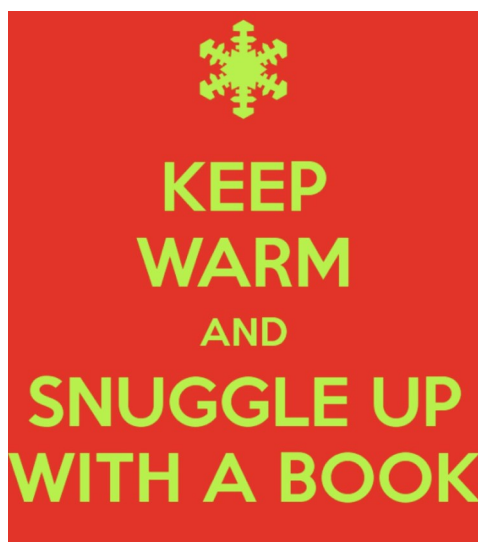
Stage 3 – Soccer Gala Day

- LARC books

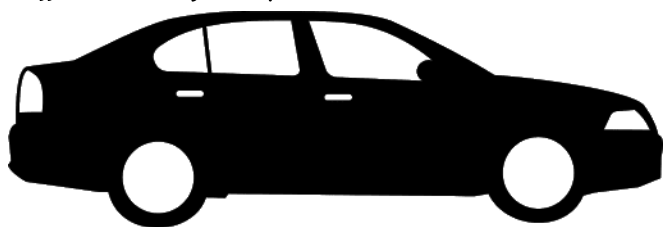
Your local library (many council run libraries offer a variety of reading material such as magazines, graphic novels, craft books, recipe books etc).

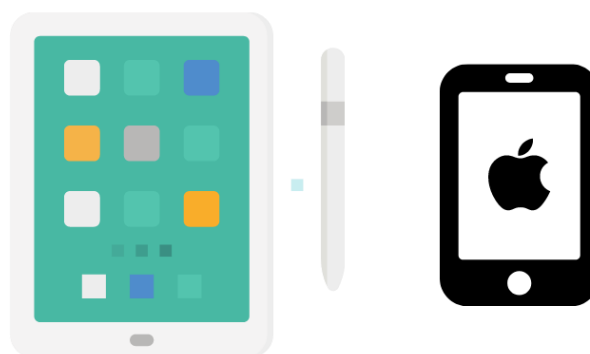
Change of Getting Home Arrangements

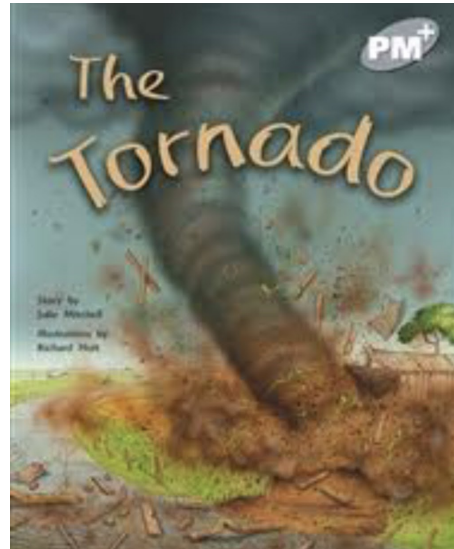
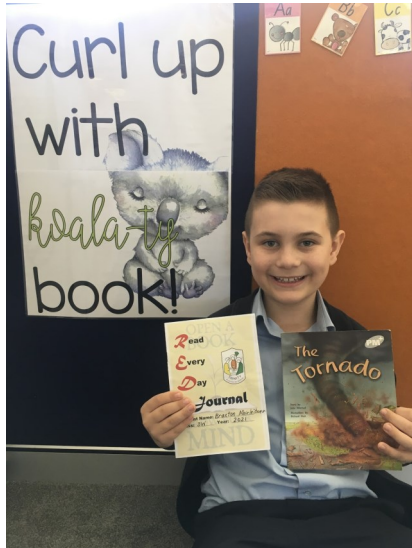




OUR READING STAR THIS WEEK ARE:

Mrs Gauci: Why do you love reading?

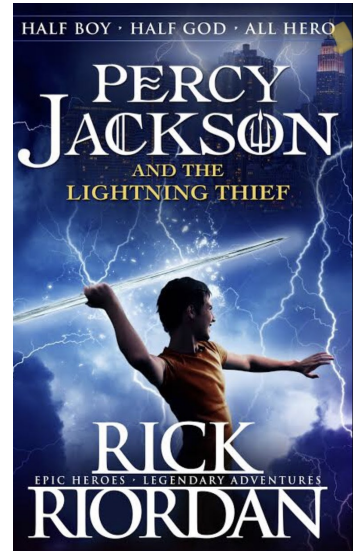
Braxton: Reading makes your brain use its imagination.
